HIFA works in official relations with WHO to accelerate progress




The first step: a global consultation of all stakeholders in the global evidence ecosystem

## How important is reliable healthcare information?

Access to reliable healthcare information is (or should be) a human right



Improving access would lead to substantial improvements in quality of care



Universal health coverage cannot be achieved without universal healthcare information



More support is needed for health literacy

## What should be done to improve the availability and use of reliable healthcare information?



Support initiatives to improve access



Promote higher standards of good practice and ethics



Support research on the availability and use of information



Ensure health workers have access to reliable healthcare information



Protect people from misinformation



Urge governments to recognise their obligation



Urge governments to provide more support for WHO

## What can HIFA do?
